### THE AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN: 27<sup>TH</sup> National Conference

Held on September 09 to 11, 2019, in Brisbane, Australia, the Conference featured Bible Studies, memorial and worship services, fellowship, fun and food, business sessions, sharing of Unit reports, and special presentations. The Executive Secretary shared a brief presentation on

the history of the FLC, and on the 2018 Project Grant reports. The Rev. Nita West is the newly appointed FLC Coordinator for ACW.

Prior to the Conference the Executive Secretary visited and met the members in New South Wales and Queensland Units. She was also able to meet Sr. Julie Adlawan of the Missionaries of God's Love, a 2018 Project Grant (Women Rise Up – Gowrie Court) partner in Canberra, ACT, Australia. As well, she had conversations about the organizational life of the FLC



with the former ICFLC Chair (2002-2004), Rev. Valamotu Palu who is now pastoring Tonga Parish Uniting Church in Sydney.



#### THE 39<sup>TH</sup> ICFLC ANNUAL MEETING IN GHANA

Hosted by the All-Africa Conference of Churches (AACC) together with the Christian Council of Ghana, the meeting was held at the Presbyterian Women's Centre in Abokobi, Accra. Mercy Amba Oduyoye, the heralded Mother of African Feminist Theology was guest speaker at the



opening worship attended by more than a hundred local church women. Three local young women observers joined the meeting. We are thankful for their lively participation and important voice in helping make the FLC programs particularly the scholarship for young women more relevant. Thank you, Regina, Celestina and Susan!

The Committee also visited the Talitha Cumi Centre in Legon, a local Project Grant partner in 2012, and the slave castles in the Cape Coast area as part of the cultural day tour. We are aiming for the 2020

AM to have all the regions represented. The Caribbean representative Rev. Marvia Lawes was not able to make it to this AM for some reasons.



A total of 19 Project Grant applications were approved, and one Scholarship Award for Young Women was granted to Ackraraporn TAKAM from Thailand.

#### The 2019 ECUMENICAL CWU PHILIPPINES ASSEMBLY

Held last November 16, the assembly was attended by more than a hundred church women where a new set of Board Members were elected. An FLC In-gathering service closed the assembly where the ICFLC Executive Secretary gave a brief reflection on the 2019 theme of the FLC In-gathering service.

#### **ASIAN ECUMENICAL WOMEN'S ASSEMBLY IN TAIWAN**

The Asian Ecumenical Women's Assembly (AEWA), organized by the Christian Conference of Asia (CCA), an ICFLC member, was held on November 22 to 27, 2019, at the Presbyterian Bible College in Shinchu, Taiwan. Hosted by the Presbyterian Church in Taiwan and attended by more around 250 ecumenical women and guests, the assembly featured Bible Studies and worship experiences, interest workshops and panel presentations.

The ICFLC Executive Secretary was a presentor for the FLC, together with the Asian Church Women's Conference (AWC), World YWCA, and the World Day of Prayer (WDP), on the Panel Discussion on the role of various ecumenical women's organisations in fully animating the Asian ecumenical movement.



"The ecumenical movement and partnership of organisations must be strengthened without any fragmentation or duplication of activities in the same constituencies." This was the common concern expressed by AEWA participants at a lively discussion after the panel presentations.
